Our Privacy Notice

Last Updated: 15 June 2026

GoFundMe Inc. together with its affiliates and subsidiaries, including GoFundMe Ireland, Limited and GoFundMe International Services UK Ltd (collectively, “GoFundMe” “we,” “our,” and “us”), provide this Privacy Notice (“Notice”) to explain how we collect, use, and disclose information about you when you interact with us offline and on any products or services on which we make this Notice available. The “Services” refers to all the products and services that we offer, including for example, when you use our mobile applications; raise funds or otherwise use any services on GoFundMe or GoFundMe Pro; or donate to one of our charity customers through our suite of online fundraising tools, services, and technology solutions provided by GoFundMe to charities (“GoFundMe Pro Software”).

Depending on the context, “you” might be a User or a GoFundMe Pro Client:

- **Users.** Our users on GoFundMe.com who donate, start fundraisers, are beneficiaries or otherwise interact with the Services or our users who donate or fundraise through the GoFundMe Pro Software used on our customer’s websites with whom we have a direct relationship when we collect their information under this Notice.

- **GoFundMe Pro Clients.** Our customers that are Charity organisations and that use our GoFundMe Pro Software, and their employees, contractors, and other authorised representatives.

Before you access, use, or submit any information through or in connection with the Services, please carefully review this Notice. By using any part of the Services, you acknowledge that you have read and understood that we may collect, use, and disclose information about you as outlined in this Notice. To the extent allowed by law, the English version of this Notice is binding, and its translations in other languages are for convenience only; in case of discrepancies between the English version of this Notice and its translations, the English version shall prevail.

This Notice does not cover the privacy practices of (i) organisers of GoFundMe fundraisers (collectively, “Organisers”), (ii) beneficiaries of fundraisers (collectively, “Beneficiaries”), or (iii) GoFundMe Pro Clients. We are not responsible for the privacy practices of Organisers, Beneficiaries, or GoFundMe Pro Clients, and their handling of your information may be subject to their own privacy statements.

This Notice also does not apply when we act as a “processor” or “service provider” on behalf of GoFundMe Pro Clients, nor does it apply when we receive donor information from a GoFundMe Pro Client to provide the Services, without having a direct relationship with the donors themselves. In those circumstances, we process information about these donors on behalf of the GoFundMe Pro Client, and these Users should consult the privacy statement of the respective GoFundMe Pro

Client they donated to for information on their privacy practices.

GOFUNDME IS A PUBLIC PLATFORM

Some parts of GoFundMe are public and can be viewed by anyone, even if they don't have an account. When you submit information or content such as photos and videos to GoFundMe to be posted on a public part of the Services, like fundraiser pages, forums or comment sections, that information and content may be visible to anyone, including public visitors and Users of our Services. The content and information may also be available in search results through search engines like Google. Please note that information you choose to share publicly is not subject to the same legal protections that apply to non-public personal data under certain data protection laws. We encourage you to consider what personal details you include in publicly available content. By using the Services, and posting to public-facing portions of the Services, you are directing us to share certain information publicly and freely.

Your GoFundMe account may include a profile page. You can choose to make your profile public or keep it private by editing your settings. [Learn more.](#)

INFORMATION WE COLLECT

As further described below, we collect information in multiple ways, including when you provide information directly to us, when we collect information about you from other parties, and when we automatically collect information from your browser or device (e.g. by logging how you interact with our Services).

A. Information That You Provide Directly to Us or Our Vendors:

I. Information Directly Collected

We and our vendors may collect information from you directly in various ways, such as when you:

- Open an account or otherwise access, use, interact, or register for the Services;
- Create a profile, fundraiser, peer-to-peer, crowdfunding, or team page on the Services or are a beneficiary for any such fundraiser;
- Share a Fundraiser or information about an individual or a Charity;
- Link your individual contacts or address book to your GoFundMe account and share information about your contacts on your phone, email, or social media accounts with GoFundMe;
- Create, register for, or purchase tickets to events, and/or other activities, and purchase merchandise;

- Set up withdrawals, transfers, or authorise payment transactions, including automated clearing house (“ACH”) transactions;
- Donate to a fundraiser, organisation, or cause, whether online, at events or through the phone;
- Post comments, leave feedback, send thank-you notes, message or otherwise communicate with other Users through our Services;
- · Fill out a survey or questionnaire or provide us with feedback regarding the Services;
- · Request certain features (e.g. newsletters, updates, and other products);
- Sign up for contests, awards and events hosted by us; or
- Play or share published videos, podcasts or other media content.

The information you provide directly to us or our vendors may relate to you or others and may include, without limitation:

Account & Profile Information: such as your name, email address, login details, postcode, country, phone number, occupation, and any additional information you voluntarily provide, like your profile picture or date of birth. If you use the Services as an organisation (e.g., by claiming your charity page on gofundme.com or as a GoFundMe Pro Client or any other registered charity), you may also provide us with your organisation’s name, your role/title within the organisation, tax identification number, 501(c)3 or tax-exempt status, and other information about your organisation such as its logo and mission statement.

Contact Information: If you choose to import your personal contacts on to your GoFundMe account, GoFundMe will collect information in your contacts, which may include information such as the names, email addresses, postcodes, locales, and phone numbers of people saved on your mobile device or your connections when you connect any of your social media accounts to GoFundMe. Learn more about how we collect and use Contact Information, and the controls available to you [here](#).

Fundraiser Information: such as a fundraiser title, location, fundraiser category, images, videos, description and goal(s) for your fundraiser.

Financial Information: such as payment account details for withdrawals, billing information and other payment information for donations, including any saved payment methods.

We use third-party payment processors to process financial information. For example, we use Stripe, Adyen and PayPal for payments, analytics, and other business services. These payment processors may collect personal data, including through cookies and similar technologies. The personal data they collect includes transactional data, identifying information about you, and information about the devices that you use to access their services. They use this data to operate and improve the services provided to us, including fraud detection, loss prevention, authentication, and performance analytics. They operate both as processors for us and independent controllers for the information they collect directly from you.

II. Publicly Available and Non-Publicly Available Communications and Content

We may collect information that you share through our Services, such as comments, feedback, thank-you notes or other communications with other Users through our Services. Any such content that you choose to post on publicly available pages through our Services is available to the public by default. Please remember that any information that is disclosed becomes public information and can be viewed, used, or shared by others, including us. Take care not to disclose information about yourself or others unless you intend for it to become public. Please also be considerate and respectful of others while using the community to publish your opinions. We reserve the right, but do not have the obligation, to review and monitor publicly-available content, non-publicly available communications between Users, and any other content made on or through our Services that may be used for internal analytics, and to remove postings or content that may be viewed as inappropriate or offensive.

III. Information about Yourself and Others, Including Sensitive Information

We may collect information about a fundraiser, including the beneficiary of a fundraiser, fundraiser goals, and other information you choose to provide, such as information about circumstances that motivate a fundraising request. Depending on what you choose to share, this information may include personal or sensitive details, such as political opinions, race, ethnicity, health information, or religious beliefs. Any sensitive information you provide is submitted voluntarily and at your discretion. If you post this information in a fundraiser, you choose to provide such information to be published publicly in relation to your fundraiser, donation, or related activity. Subject to applicable law, GoFundMe may process or use any information that has manifestly been made public, including information about you or others that reveals sensitive information, for purposes consistent with operating and administering the Services.

If you provide us with any information about others, like by sharing your contact list or address book with us, you acknowledge and agree that you have the authority and consent of the relevant other parties for us to access, disclose, and use the relevant data, and that you have notified the other parties and informed them of how their information is collected and used by us to provide the Services. We reserve the right to identify you as the person who has made the referral in any messages that are sent to them.

Even if you do not create a GoFundMe account or otherwise use our Services, we may still collect information about you when another User provides your information to us, for example by sharing their contact list, address book, or similar details stored with a third-party service, such as LinkedIn.

IV. Chats and Other Communications with Us

We may collect information for troubleshooting or support services when you call or chat with us. We may engage vendors to provide certain features, such as chat features (including AI chatbots) on our Services. Your use of these features is voluntary, and we (and our vendors) may record your calls with our support service and retain the transcripts or call recordings including for training and quality assurance purposes. For example, we may offer an interactive chat feature on the Services for customer service purposes or as an interactive “coach” to help you launch your fundraiser or attract more donors. We would ask that you take care not to send financial or health information, data about minors without their parent or guardian’s consent, or other sensitive personal data to us through our chat services or other means. When you provide such information to us directly, we will only process this information if we have a legal basis for doing so. We collect the information listed in this section for the purposes described below in the sections “Our Use of Information Collected” and “Our Disclosure of Information Collected About You.”

V. Biometric Information

We sometimes engage vendors to collect biometric information for identity verification, regulatory compliance, and fraud prevention purposes. We or the vendors we engage may collect a copy of your government-issued ID (i.e., your driver’s licence, state ID card, or passport) and a scan of the picture on your government-issued ID for identification purposes. Our vendors may, with your consent, employ facial recognition

technology to verify your identity and share the results of their analysis with us, if needed. GoFundMe does not have access to or otherwise collect or maintain any biometric information. Your biometric information will be retained by our vendors in compliance with applicable laws, and subject to their retention and privacy policies.

B. Information We Collect from Other Parties:

I. Data Enhancement Information

GoFundMe uses vendors to improve the quality of our User platform so that we might improve or market our Services to you, for verification, compliance and fraud prevention purposes, and as otherwise described in this Notice. In addition, GoFundMe obtains contact details and other personal information regarding media contacts and influencers from various groups such as Cision and Muck Rack. See the [Cision privacy policy](#) and the [Muck Rack privacy policy](#) for further information.

II. Payment Processing Information

Our payment processors collect and provide certain information about You to us in order for us and them to process any payments you make on GoFundMe, or any money you may be eligible to withdraw. For example, when you donate to a fundraiser or charity on GoFundMe via ACH using Plaid Technologies, Inc. (“Plaid”), we may use Plaid to gather certain data from financial institutions, like your name, email, bank information, postcode, and country. By electing to link to Plaid,

you (i) grant us and Plaid the right, power, and authority to act on your behalf to access and transmit your personal and financial information from the relevant financial institution and (ii) you agree to your personal and financial information being transferred, stored, and processed by us and Plaid in accordance with this Notice and the [Plaid Privacy Policy](#).

III. Account and Profile Information from Third-Party Services

One of the special features of some of the Services is that they allow you to enable or log into the Services via various applications/services, including social media applications/services, like Facebook, X, LinkedIn, Google or Apple, or to upload videos using YouTube APIs (each and collectively, the “Third-Party Service(s)”).

By directly integrating these Third-Party Services, we aim to make your online experiences richer and more personalised. Some features may also allow you to schedule posts on Third-Party Services through our platform. If you choose to use this scheduling tool, you will have control over when, where, and how posts are published. While we enable you to provide the content for these posts, you can decide whether to use this feature. We will never post on your behalf without you actively setting up and authorising the post schedule.

To take advantage of these features, we will ask you to provide your credentials for the applicable Third-Party Services in order to log in to our Services. When you add a Third-Party Services account to the Services or log into the Services using your Third-Party Services account, we will collect the relevant information necessary to enable the Services to access that

Third-Party Service. As part of such integration, the Third-Party Service will provide us with access to certain information that you have provided to the Third-Party Service and made available to us based on your privacy settings with the Third-Party Service (for example, your name and photograph, as well as other information that you permit the Third-Party Service to share with us). We will use, store, and disclose such information in accordance with this Notice. However, please remember that the manner in which Third-Party Services use, store, and disclose your information is governed by the policies of such third parties, and GoFundMe shall have no liability or responsibility for the privacy practices or other actions of any Third-Party Services that may be enabled within the Services. For example, if you upload a video onto your fundraiser using the mobile application for the Services, your video will be uploaded using YouTube and subject to Google's [Privacy Policy](#) and [Terms of Service](#).

You further acknowledge that if you choose to use this feature, your friends, followers, and subscribers on any Third-Party Services you have enabled may be able to view such activity. For example, if you sign on using Meta, Meta's [Privacy Policy](#) and [Terms of Service](#) would apply to the data Meta might obtain from your activities on GoFundMe. Similarly, if you sign on using Google, Google's Privacy Policy and Terms of Service would apply to the data Google might obtain from your activities on GoFundMe. Please visit the terms of use and privacy policy of the relevant Third Party Service to learn more about your rights and choices, and to exercise your choices about those technologies.

C. Information That is Passively or Automatically Collected:

I. Device & Browser Information:

When you interact with GoFundMe through the Services, we automatically receive and store certain information from devices and browsers that you use to access or view the Services. This information is collected passively and includes your cookie IDs, social network ID, mobile device ID, mobile advertising IDs, the website from which you have come to the Services, and your IP address to estimate your general location (as described further below under “Location Information”).

We will also receive information about your browser or device type, operating system, network information, our mobile application’s configurations, and other such technical metadata. This information may be used by us and/or our vendors, together with the other information we receive as provided in this Notice, including to recognise your device or browser, to identify you or for fraud detection, fraud prevention or security purposes.

We may also collect information about the photos or videos you upload to our Services. For example, if you upload a photo to the Services, depending on your device settings we may receive the date, time, and location it was taken. We may use this metadata to make inferences about your general location for the purposes described below, as explained in “Our Use of Information Collected” section of this Notice.

II. Location Information:

We may use your IP address to infer the postcode, city or town, region and country of residence. This imprecise location

information is used to provide you with an optimised browsing experience, suggest donations or tips to you, to recommend fundraisers or community activities within your general area, and as otherwise set forth in this Notice.

When you use the Services to organise a fundraiser, the Services may require that you provide your postcode, city or town, and region/country. Please keep in mind that other users of the Services can view your postcode, city or town, and region/country in connection with the fundraiser.

If you install our mobile application, we may ask you to grant us access to your mobile device's precise geolocation data. If you grant such permission, we may collect information about your precise geolocation, and we may use that information to improve the Services we provide to you, such as providing you with location-based features (e.g. to prepopulate your postcode or to identify fundraisers near you). You may also give us access to your location using the setting configurations on your web browser. Certain devices or operating systems may permit you to opt out of providing your precise geolocation information. Please check your settings if you want to limit such tracking. If you have any questions about the privacy settings of your device or operating system, we suggest you contact the manufacturer of your device or operating system for help.

We may also use your imprecise or precise location information in an aggregate way as described below in the "Aggregated Data" section.

III. Site Usage & Session Information:

We collect information about your interaction with our Services, including the resources that you access, pages viewed, how much time you spent on a page, and how you reached our website. We may also use session replay technology to collect information on a real-time basis and log the details of your visits to our website and information generated in the course of using our website, such as mouse movements, clicks, taps, swipes, page visits, how long you spent on a page, and other details of your actions on our website, including information you view. We may share this information with our agents/vendors to analyse and organise any collected data on our behalf and at our express direction.

IV. Cookies & Other Electronic Technologies:

Please review the “[Online Analytics and Targeted Advertising](#)” section below as well as our [Cookie Policy](#) for information on the types of cookies and similar technologies that we or our vendors use on the Services, like on our websites and mobile apps, how we use these technologies, and how you can manage your Cookie and mobile privacy preferences.

Some web and mobile device browsers may accept cookies by default. If you prefer, you can usually change your browser to prevent that or to notify you each time a new cookie is set. You can turn off non-essential cookies, but some or all of our Services may not work as intended. Essential cookies cannot be turned off because they ensure the site works as it should.

As to the information in this “Information That is Passively or Automatically Collected” Section, GoFundMe either stores such information itself or such information is included in databases

owned and maintained by GoFundMe, and/or its agents or vendors.

OUR USE OF INFORMATION COLLECTED

GoFundMe uses the information collected from the Services in a manner that is consistent with this Notice. We may use information that you voluntarily provide to us, information you permit the Services to access, and information collected through your use of the Services, for the purposes described in this Notice, including the following purposes:

A. Provision of Services

We process personal information to provide, operate, and maintain the Services, including to register and maintain your account, add information to your Profile and to facilitate financial transactions. In order to provide certain Services, we would verify your identity, facilitate the Know Your Customer (“KYC”) verification process, and use your information to detect and prevent fraud or other misuses of the Services. We will also use your data to communicate with you for various purposes, including to help you fundraise or donate to a cause, share updates with you, request your feedback or for administrative purposes (e.g., to provide services and information that you request or to respond to comments and questions) regarding the Services. If you import your personal contacts to your GoFundMe account from your contact list, address book, or a third-party service, we will use that information as needed to help you raise more funds for your fundraiser on GoFundMe.

We may also communicate with you regarding your GoFundMe account by SMS, MMS, or text message. For example, when setting up your GoFundMe account, if you click “Send code”, you agree to receive automated and non-automated text messages related to your account from or on behalf of GoFundMe at the phone number provided. You can reply STOP to such text messages to cancel, except for automated text messages related to the security of your account. Message frequency will vary. Except when we collect mobile numbers on behalf of GoFundMe Pro Clients on their websites, we do not share mobile phone numbers with any third parties for them to use for their own marketing/promotional purposes. If we intend to share a mobile number in other instances, we will first check with you for any objections before proceeding. We will not use text messaging originator opt-in data or consent for other types of communication (such as email), nor will we share this information with third parties, except as outlined in this Notice. In the event you change or deactivate your mobile telephone number, you agree to promptly update your GoFundMe account information to ensure that your messages are not misdirected. Please note that your wireless service carrier’s standard charges, message and data rates, and other fees may apply where you access the Services through a mobile device. In addition, downloading, installing, or using certain Services on a mobile device may be prohibited or restricted by your carrier, and not all Services may work with all carriers or devices. For more information, please refer to the SMS Terms of Service [here](#).

B. Personalisation of our Services

We may use information to analyse, improve, modify, personalise, and measure the Services, including to optimise

our websites, and develop and train our artificial intelligence (“AI”) or machine learning (“ML”) models. We do not use your data to train AI models for the development of general-purpose commercial AI products that are unrelated to the Services.

We may use AI, ML, and other analytics tools to further enhance your experience on our platform and to develop the Services. These tools are offered to help Users create, draft and promote fundraisers; create posts, photos or videos to share their fundraisers; provide a conversational chatbot to assist with the fundraiser creation and management process; or to otherwise optimise the use of our Services. We may also use these tools to tailor emails to you; make recommendations; highlight causes, fundraisers, and pages likely to interest you; help protect you and your account from misuse; and suggest prospective donors, fundraising goals or donation amounts. Also, we may use information you have provided to make suggestions about actions you or others may want to take on the platform, such as starting a fundraiser for your birthday.

For our GoFundMe Pro Clients, we offer an Intelligent Ask Amounts feature (IAA) that suggests a personalised donation amount to donors. If you are a donor and prefer we not use your data for IAA, you may submit an opt-out request [here](#).

We and our AI vendors may collect and retain transcripts or other information from your interactions with us for training, content moderation, and quality assurance purposes. When you provide such information directly to us, you consent to the processing of this data by GoFundMe and/or our AI vendors for these purposes.

We may use information you provide in your profile, such as your place of work or school, to personalise your experience, including by suggesting people you may know on the Platform. If you share your contact list or address book with us, we may also use that information to suggest more relevant sharing options for your fundraiser.

We also may use information we collect from you, such as the charities or fundraisers you donated to, pinned, or added to your lists, the causes you selected to support or share, and the people you follow or message, to draw inferences based on your profile and interactions with our Services. These inferences help us further personalise your experience. For example, we may recommend public profiles, causes, fundraisers, or other content that may be relevant to you based on your activity and interactions on the Platform. In some instances, we also may rank content more highly in your feed or search results based on factors such as whether the content relates to a cause that we infer interests you, the users you interact with on our Services, your location, the categories or causes associated with your fundraiser, a fundraiser's proximity to its fundraising goal, or how recently it has received donations. These parameters also help us further personalise your experience, subject to your consent choices, and make it easier to find fundraisers you may care about. You can use filters to influence how fundraisers are shown to you.

When you create a fundraiser or interact with a fundraiser, charity, community, or other content on our Services, we may automatically designate you as "following" that content, but you always will have the option to unfollow. We may use who you follow to provide updates and notifications related to that

activity, which may be delivered within the Platform and, where permitted by law, by email. You may manage your notification preferences at any time through the Platform.

C. Improvement of our Services for You

We may use information to develop new products and services and for other research and development;

D. Promote Trust, Integrity, and Security

We may use information to maintain the security of your account and any associated fundraisers, and to detect, prevent, and address fraud. We and our AI vendors may also use information you provide, as well as any information generated while using our AI features, for content moderation and other purposes consistent with our Terms of Service.

E. Compliance with Legal Obligations

We may use information to comply with legal obligations, law enforcement requests and legal processes, and to protect our rights, privacy, safety, or property, and/or that of our affiliates, you, or other parties, including to enforce our Terms of Service and any other agreements; and

F. Other Purposes

We may also aggregate, hash and/or de-identify information collected through the Services. We may use and disclose aggregated, hashed and/or de-identified information for any

purpose, including, without limitation, research, marketing purposes and as described in the “Online Analytics and Targeted Advertising” section below.

OUR DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION COLLECTED ABOUT YOU

There are certain circumstances in which we disclose information collected about you with certain other parties without further notice to you, as set forth below.

A. Business Transfers:

As we develop our business, we might sell or buy businesses or assets. In the event of a corporate sale, merger, reorganisation, dissolution, similar event, or steps taken in anticipation of such events (e.g. due diligence in a transaction), user information may be part of the reviewed and transferred assets.

B. Affiliates and Subsidiaries:

We disclose your personal information among the GoFundMe entities, including our affiliates and subsidiaries, for purposes consistent with this Notice, such as to provide our Services, including hosting, marketing, and publicising fundraisers; providing you with customer support; administering funds in connection with fundraisers; preventing fraud and misuse; authenticating donors; sending you communications; improving Services offered by the various GoFundMe entities and conducting the other activities described in this Notice.

C. Agents, Consultants, and Vendors:

GoFundMe contracts with other companies to help us perform certain business-related functions, and we provide access to or disclose your information with these companies so they can perform services for us. These functions include marketing, mailing information, data storage, security, identity verification, payment processing, preventing fraud and misuse, legal services, and database maintenance. We use Alloy, an identity verification and fraud prevention platform, to help verify identities and prevent fraud. You can review Alloy's privacy notice at <https://uk.alloy.com/privacy-policy>. If you are based in Canada, you understand that GoFundMe will use third party service providers to check your personal information you provide GoFundMe against various databases including credit reporting agencies and telecommunications providers for the purpose of identity verification.

D. Legal Requirements:

We may transfer, disclose to, and preserve your information for courts, law enforcement, governmental or public authorities, tax authorities, or authorised third parties, if and to the extent we are required or permitted to do so by law or where disclosure is reasonably necessary to: (i) comply with our legal obligations, (ii) comply with a valid legal request (such as a subpoena or court order), (iii) respond to claims asserted against us, (iv) respond to a valid legal request relating to a criminal investigation to address alleged or suspected illegal activity or to respond to or address any other activity that may expose us, you or any other of our users or members of the

public to imminent harm, legal or regulatory liability, (v) enforce and administer our Terms of Service or other policies, or (vi) protect the rights, property or personal safety of GoFundMe, its affiliates, its employees, its users, or members of the public.

E. Organisers, Charity Beneficiaries, and GoFundMe Pro Clients:

I. Organisers.

We disclose information about donors to Organisers, which can be either an individual or a charity. In some cases, the Organiser of a fundraiser is also the Beneficiary, meaning they are raising funds for themselves, while in others they are different parties. For example, your contact information may be shared with the Organiser or the Beneficiary, so that they can send you a thank you message, provide you a receipt, or contact you about the fundraiser.

II. Charity Beneficiaries.

Organisers may create fundraisers designating a charity as a beneficiary. Where a charity is designated as the Beneficiary, that charity may access certain information about the Organiser and donors (even if a donor has chosen to donate anonymously), including the Organiser's or donor's name, email address, donation amount, date of transaction, transaction identification number, and name of the campaign, where applicable. If you start a fundraiser for a charity, you authorise us to disclose your information, such as your name and email, to the charity for whom you are fundraising. Likewise, if you donate to a charity through the Services, you direct us to

disclose your donation, contact information and any other information you provide to the applicable charity. When we pass information to charities, they become controllers of that information. III. GoFundMe Pro Clients and Their Vendors/Partners.

IV. “Anonymous” Donations Limited to Public Activity Feeds.

If you selected not to be named publicly on the public fundraiser pages on the Services, while your donation will be designated as “anonymous” on the fundraiser’s public activity feed, your name and other information may still be visible to the GoFundMe Pro Client, Organiser, any of their team members and the Beneficiary, and will be otherwise processed in accordance with this Notice. Additionally, based on your donations to certain fundraisers or charities, your Profile name may be displayed as a follower of those charities or related communities, subject to your notification and privacy settings.

F. Your Consent

In certain situations, we may disclose your information when you consented to the disclosure of your information. For example, we may partner with third party organisations to arrange for specific fundraisers. If you consent to our providing your contact information to a specific partner, we will disclose the following information with the partner organisation: your name, email address and other information you have provided in connection with your donation to the specific fundraiser. If you want to change your preferences for a specific partner to use your data (to contact you or otherwise), please contact the partner directly. Additionally, with the applicable Organiser’s or Beneficiary’s consent, we may provide their personal information to journalists and media to help amplify a campaign/fundraiser.

G. Aggregated Data

We aggregate, anonymise and/or de-identify information collected actively or passively about you so that the information no longer relates to you individually. We then use that data for various legally permissible purposes, including but not limited to our research on our customer demographics, interests and behaviour. We also disclose this information with our affiliates, agents, business partners, research facilities or other third parties.

H. Cookies and Other Electronic Technologies

Information is disclosed as stated in the [Cookie Policy](#).

I. Other Users of Our Services

We provide your information to other users of our Services if you choose to make your information publicly available in a publicly accessible area of the Services, such as in your fundraiser, through your donations, or in the comments. Additionally, if you choose to make your personal profile public, actions like when you donate to a fundraiser or start one may appear in an activity feed to individuals who may follow you.

VOLUNTEERED INFORMATION

We also collect information through forums and communities, surveys and customer support communications, your communication to us of ideas for new products or modifications to existing products, feedback, and other solicited or

unsolicited submissions (collectively, with publicly-accessible information, “Volunteered Information”). Subject to applicable law, by sending us Volunteered Information, you further agree that we are under no obligation of confidentiality, express or implied, with respect to the Volunteered Information. This Volunteered Information section shall survive any termination of your account or the Services.

ONLINE ANALYTICS AND TARGETED ADVERTISING

A. Online Analytics.

We may use third-party web and product analytics services on the Services, such as Google Analytics. These vendors use the sort of technology described in the “Information That is Passively or Automatically Collected” section above to help us analyse how Users use the Services, including by noting the third-party website from which you arrive and in emails we send to you so we know whether you open an email we sent to you or interact with its content.
